About Crestline-Lake Arrowhead (C-LA) Water Agency: Crestline-Lake Arrowhead Water Agency is a public agency created in 1962 by a special act of the California State Legislature to provide supplemental water to a portion of the San Bernardino Mountains. As a State Water Contractor, the Agency sells imported water wholesale to approximately 25 retail water purveyors for domestic use and fire protection purposes. This water supply benefits the permanent population within the Agency's boundary, along with the many additional people who visit within the Agency seasonally or during weekends, and approximately 1,200 retail customers. The Agency's water supply has also been used to help fight and control the major fires within and near the Agency's borders.



WHY ARE THE STATE WATER PROJECT AND DELTA CONVEYANCE PROJECT IMPORTANT TO CRESTLINE-LAKE ARROWHEAD?

"The Agency's sole source of water is Silverwood Lake, a State Water Project reservoir. Many of the Agency's customers rely exclusively on SWP water for their domestic needs and for fire protection. The Agency's water supply has continued to diminish over the years due to environmental concerns in the Delta. The Delta Conveyance Project offers a way to prevent further reductions in the Agency's water supply while also addressing environmental and endangered species concerns in the Delta. Completion of the DCP is vitally important to the Agency, to the San Bernardino Mountains, and to the State of California."
