

**NOTICE OF INTENTION
TO AMEND THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF DELTA CONVEYANCE
DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the **Delta Conveyance Design & Construction Authority**, pursuant to the authority vested in it by section 87306 of the Government Code, proposes amendment to its conflict of interest code. A comment period has been established commencing on May 15, 2026 and closing on June 29, 2026. All inquiries should be directed to the contact listed below.

Delta Conveyance Design & Construction Authority proposes to amend its conflict of interest code to include employee positions that involve the making or participation in the making of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest, as set forth in subdivision (a) of section 87302 of the Government Code. The amendment carries out the purposes of the law and no other alternative would do so and be less burdensome to affected persons.

Changes to the conflict of interest code include: based on the need to include new positions that must be designated, revises titles of existing positions and also makes other technical changes.

The proposed amendment and explanation of the reasons can be obtained from the agency's contact, Clerk of the Board at info@dcdca.org and/or the agency's website www.dcdca.org.

Any interested person may submit written comments relating to the proposed amendment by submitting them no later than June 29, 2026, or at the conclusion of the public hearing, if requested, whichever comes later. At this time, no public hearing is scheduled. A person may request a hearing no later than June 14, 2026.

The **Delta Conveyance Design & Construction Authority** has determined that the proposed amendments:

1. Impose no mandate on local agencies or school districts.
2. Impose no costs or savings on any state agency.
3. Impose no costs on any local agency or school district that are required to be reimbursed under Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
4. Will not result in any nondiscretionary costs or savings to local agencies.
5. Will not result in any costs or savings in federal funding to the state.
6. Will not have any potential cost impact on private persons, businesses or small businesses.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act (Gov. Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code Regulations Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the **Delta Conveyance Design & Construction Authority (the "Authority")**.

Members of the Board of Directors, Board Alternates, Treasurer and Executive Director shall electronically file their statements of economic interests directly with the Fair Political Practices Commission. All other officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the **Executive Director** as the Authority's Filing Officer/Official who shall make all retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction during regular business hours. Consultants and New Positions*

* Consultant/new positions shall be included in the list of designated positions and shall disclosure pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitation:

The Executive Director may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position", is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to comply fully with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Director's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.)

PART "B"

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

Category 1: All investments, business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments). Real property located within the jurisdiction, as well as real property within two miles of the real property owned or used by the Authority or the potential site.

Category 2: Interests in real property located in whole or in part within the boundaries of the Authority or within two (2) miles of the Authority, including any leasehold, beneficial or ownership interest or option to acquire such interest in property.

Category 3: Investments, business positions in business entities, and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source is engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the Authority.

Category 4: Investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the Authority.

Category 5: Investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the designated position's department

Category 6: Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments) if the business entity or source has, during the reporting period, filed a claim or has a claim pending before the Authority.
